### M. Lawrence G.R. Demi-Sec

Leelanau Peninsula, MI. *Labeled specifically for Grand Rapids. Vidal and Muscat are fermented with the cuvee closed method.*

### M. Lawrence Sex

Leelanau Peninsula, MI. *Bold fruits intertwine with yeast and delicate bubbles from a blend of Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grapes, creating a gorgeous pink hue.*

### L. Mawby Blanc de Blanc

Leelanau Peninsula, MI. *Silky and creamy complexity with a citrus zip. Twice fermented and created with predominantly Chardonnay grapes.*

### R.H. Coutier *Grand Cru* Blanc de Blancs Brut

Ambonnay, FR. *100% Chardonnay aged in stainless steel. Apple, white stone fruit and citrus on the nose with a creamy texture and mineral tones that round out racy acidity. This wine is the epiphany of what a Grand Cru represents.*

## WHITE

### Cantina Colli Euganei Prosecco Spumante

Euganean Hills, IT. *Harvested from volcanic soil. Has a refined minerality and earthiness with hints of fruit, and a pleasant and a dry mouth feel.*

### Hybrid Pinot Grigio

Lodi, CA. *Certified organic, this Pinot Grigio starts with aromas of ripe citrus, mellow fruits and finishes with a bright vibrancy.*

### Corvidae *Ravenna* Riesling

Yakima Valley, WA. *Fermented in 100% stainless steel to preserve the bright stone fruit aromatics, this wine carries a rich palate weight and plenty of tropical fruit notes that are accented with honey and ginger with a crisp and clean finish.*

### Foncalieu Piquepoul Rosé

Languedoc-Roussillon, FR. *100% Piquepoul Noir has this rosé offering notes of under ripe peach, white melon and currant. Light and easy with citrus and tart berry flavor that create a clean finish.*

### BigLITTLE Open Road Rosé

Leelanau, MI. *A blend of several varietals including Pinot Gris and Marechal Foch are sustainably harvested in Northern Michigan. Ripe red fruit on the palate with a crisp backbone and bright acidity. With only 275 cases being produced, this wine is a rare gem from a small family winery.*

### Vina Robles Estate Rosé

Paso Robles, CA. *Inspired by the refreshing rosés from Southern France. Hand harvested Syrah grapes are blended with a touch of Viognier. Wild cherry and ripe plum on the nose are finished with lively, expressive quenching fruit.*

### Villa Wolf Gewürztraminer

Pfalz, DE. *Harvested in the Pfalz region of Southwest Germany, which has a warmer climate and predominantly sandstone soil. Stainless steel fermentation enhances minerality and rose petal aromas with an exotic spice palate, produced in an off-dry style.*

### Allen Scott Sauvignon Blanc

Marlborough, NZ. *Vineyards are sustainably managed in the stony Wairau Valley river flats which have produced the citrus and herbaceous characters expected from a Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc.*

### Rustenberg Sauvignon Blanc

Stellenbosch, South Africa. *100% Sauvignon Blanc hand-harvested and aged less than 2-3 months on lees with tropical fruit aromas and a fresh, crisp balanced palate that is a little lengthier than the average Sauvignon Blanc.*

### Paul Anheuser Blanc de Noir

Nahe Valley, DE. *The Anheuser family has been producing world class wines since the 19<sup>th</sup> century and the current vintners are the 14<sup>th</sup> generation to own and manage the vineyards. An unusual white and dry-styled 100% Pinot Noir from free-run juice that presents good firm structure and hints of cherry and blossom on the palate accented by zesty grapefruit and lemon flavors.*

### Collovray & Terrier Macon Villages *Tradition* Chardonnay

Burgundy, FR. *This region within Burgundy is known for its extended sun exposure and limestone hills where these grapes are harvested. Pale gold hue, stone fruit and floral aromas with a tart green apple palate are balanced with resounding minerality.*

### Nathaniel Rose Marsanne

Traverse City, MI. *Considered an “orange” wine due to the fermentation of Marsanne on skins all the way to dryness extracting its unique hue. Aged 18 months in French oak with some viscosity on the mouthfeel and presents some earthy floral tones.*

### Castello Della Sala *Bramìto del Cervo* Chardonnay

Umbria, IT. *This 100% Chardonnay is aged in French oak for 5 months along with partial malolactic fermentation, bringing a light yellow hue and a bouquet of apples and pineapple followed with vibrant minerality & a long, complex finish.*

## RED

### Mas de Daumas Moulin de Gassac Guilhem Rouge

Languedoc – Roussillon, FR. *Blend of Syrah and Grenache with a touch of Carignan and Mouvèdre develop hints of spicy strawberry and rich red berry. This is a delicate wine rounded with smooth tannins.*

### Zolo Estate Malbec

Mendoza, Argentina. *100% estate grown Malbec, sustainably farmed & hand-harvested using double-manual selection to ensure the quality of the grapes are to their standards and sees 6 months of French oak aging. Deep purple hue with a violet perfume and intense black fruits and raspberries.*

### Girls in the Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon

Lake County, CA. *Cassis, currant and dark cherry bouquet lead to a mid-weighted wine where the cassis flows through the palate along with cocoa and some earthiness to give this a rounded experience.*

### Klinker Brick Old Vine Zinfandel

Lodi, CA. *This old vine zinfandel is a blend of 16 different vineyard blocks of old vines with an average of 86 years.*

*With berries and spice on the nose, dark sweet fruits fill the palate with just a hint of black pepper and a long lingering finish.*

### H. Mynors Zinfandel

Sonoma, Dry Creek Valley, Amador County & Lodi, CA. *Aged for 12 months in French oak which leads to floral aromatics with a spicy palate and finish. Soft tannins are balanced with a lingering sweet, oaky finish.*

### Moulin de Gasaac Pinot Noir

Languedoc-Roussillon, FR. *100% Pinot Noir organically farmed and hand-harvested. Grown in the warm climate of the Mediterranean with cool ocean breezes and slightly higher altitude, making an ideal environment for growing. Lighter-style Pinot Noir fermented in stainless steel giving this wine a plum and earthy aroma followed with a silky, velvet finish.*

### Chateau de Chamilly Pinot Noir

Bourgogne, FR. *100% Pinot Noir hand-harvested from 70-year-old vines which produce this elegant, unfiltered wine developing a dark berry nose and floral cherry earthiness mid-palate with a touch of spice and bright minerality from the terroir.*

### Fabre Montmayou Reserva Cabernet Franc

Mendoza, AR. *100% Cabernet Franc that is hand harvested and sorted, this wine exhibits an intense red color with an elegant nose. Red and black fruit aromas fill the palate with hints of mint finishing long and strong.*

### Cepa 21 Tempranillo

Bodegas, SP. *Tempranillo, known locally as Tinto Fino, is a varietal that is perfected suited for the extreme climate in the region with scorching summers and frigid winters producing low yields which leads to depth and complexity not found in other Tempranillos, showing through the deep aromas and hue. The palate consists of black cherry and currant finishing with detailed oak spiciness.*

### Puglia Gran Appasso Rosso

Passito, IT. *The name Gran Appasso comes from the ancient winemaking technique of allowing the fruit to stay on the vines slightly beyond maturation, allowing them to begin to lose their moisture, which results in condensed and enhanced nuances from the Primativo and Negroamaro varietals. This full-bodied wine with jammy and plum notes on the palate finishes long and tannic with cocoa nuances from the oak aging process.*

### Force of Nature Red Blend

Paso Robles, CA. *Predominately Merlot with Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah and Petite Sirah blend to provide a deep red hue, a nose that blooms with red cherry and plum and supple tannins. Balanced with acidity and restrained structure and a lingering finish.*

### Coto de Hayas Grenacha Centenaria

Aragon, SP. *Granacha vines planted over 100 years ago are located in an arid slate terroir then hand-harvested and aged four months in French oak revealing strong ripe red fruit aromas and spicy violet on the palate, finished with heft and substantial grip.*

### Big Table Farm Pinot Noir

Willamette Valley, OR. *Producers of this unfiltered wine have a cult-like following. Featuring green peppercorn & herb on the nose, dark red fruit on the palate, balanced with sweet toasted notes on the finish. Quick decanting is recommended.*

### Montoya Cabernet Sauvignon

Montoya, CA. *Made from grapes grown on the family farm vineyard along the Silverado Trail in St. Helena. Aromas of black pepper and currant gracefully joined with flavors of blackberry, plum and vanilla finishing rich and toasty.*

<b>Owen Rowe Ex Umbris Syrah</b>	<b>68</b>
<i>Yakima Valley, WA. Ex Umbris translates as “out of the shadows” in Latin and has become a signature wine from Owen Rowe, first created as a result from a local fire near the vineyards. Aged 14 months in French oak with vibrant aromas of dark red fruit and spice that are mirrored on the palate with a savory and structured finish highlighted with smokiness from the toasted oak barrels.</i>	
<b>Gerard Bertrand Corbieres</b>	<b>54</b>
<i>Corbieres, Languedoc-Roussillon, FR. Blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvedre. Fruit is all hand-harvested with each varietal vinified separately then blended in barrique for eight months producing a deep hue with dark berries balanced with spicy, earthy notes and licorice, ending with a full, structured mouthfeel.</i>	
<b>d’Arenberg High Trellis Cabernet Sauvignon</b>	<b>56</b>
<i>McLaren Vale, AUS. Harvested from sustainably managed vineyards dating over a century, the core of this wine has cassis, licorice and plum mixed with earth and graphite minerality. Balanced and weighted, with lacy tannins on the finish.</i>	
<b>Tenuta di Sesta Poggio d’Arna Toscano Rosso</b>	<b>50</b>
<i>Montalcino, IT. The traditional varietal blend of Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Sangiovese comprise this “Super Tuscan.” Deep ruby red and vibrant purple hues with some spiciness on the nose and a structured palate with velvety tannins.</i>	
<b>Vinca Minor Red Blend</b>	<b>56</b>
<i>Redwood Valley, CA. Zinfandel, Petite Sirah and Carignan, all organically farmed and harvested, bringing strong fruit aromas with an inky, peppery palate finishing silky yet balanced with medium tannins.</i>	
<b>Tooth &amp; Nail The Fiend</b>	<b>68</b>
<i>Paso Robles, CA. Harvested from Tolliver Ranch, which contains an acidic soil that is unusual for this region. This wine is comprised of primarily Malbec blended with Cabernet Sauvignon. Inky purple hue is surrounded with floral lavender aromas and a lush, bright palate continuing with supple tannins and acidity.</i>	
<b>Château Pérenne Cru Bourgeois</b>	<b>58</b>
<i>Bordeaux, FR. 93% Merlot and 7% Cabernet Sauvignon planted in clay and gravel, then sees over a year in new French oak, yielding prune and violet aromas, plum, tobacco and figs mid-palate with a spicy firm tannic finish.</i>	
<b>Hoopla The Mutt Cabernet Sauvignon</b>	<b>67</b>
<i>Napa Valley, CA. 98% Cabernet Sauvignon blended with 2% of Merlot for texture, aged 18 months in French oak. Hand-harvested fruit from the Yountville, Oakville &amp; St. Helena regions of Napa Valley create this medium-bodied wine with raspberry and blueberry aromas flowing into a soft, creamy texture and a bright finish. Inspired by the winemaker’s rescue dogs, Sophie &amp; Maya.</i>	
<b>Tres Sabores ¿Por Què No?</b>	<b>52</b>
<i>Napa Valley, CA. From a small certified organic &amp; family-owned vineyard comes this blend of Zinfandel, Cabernet Sauvignon &amp; Petite Syrah. Fruit forward with substance &amp; texture, and finishes with an earthy &amp; robust character.</i>	
<b>Chateau de la font du Loup Chateaneuf-du-Pape</b>	<b>80</b>
<i>Rhone, FR. Located at one of the highest points in Châteaneuf-du-Pape, Chateau font du Loup, which translates to “fountain of the wolves”, is named after natural springs in the area. Font du Loup has been in the Melia family since 1942. Primarily Grenache blend with Syrah, Cinsault and Mourvedre providing a medium-bodied, rustic palate focused on bright red fruits, fresh herbs and a rich, earthy finish. We recommend decanting for at least 20 minutes to allow the wine’s bouquet to bloom.</i>	
<b>Vina Robles Petite Sirah</b>	<b>54</b>
<i>Paso Robles, CA. 100% estate-grown, hand harvested and aged 20 months in French oak. Deep garnet hue leads into black cherry, mocha, and vanilla on the nose and palate, finishing with full-bodied, juicy and meaty tannins.</i>	
<b>Pas Curtei</b>	<b>48</b>
<i>Catalonia, Spain. 60% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 25% Carugnan. Manually harvested in small boxes and fermented according to their individual variety. Full of black fruit and silky tannins this Bordeaux-esque wine has a finish slightly bitter with smoky remembrances.</i>	
<b>Roberts &amp; Rogers Cabernet Sauvignon</b>	<b>94</b>
<i>Napa Valley, CA. Traditional, full-bodied California-styled Cabernet Sauvignon blended with 10% Merlot to create a layered depth of bold dark cherry, spiced plums as a result of 15 months of age in French oak barrels and juicy tannins on the finish.</i>	
<b>Orin Swift Papillon Bordeaux Blend</b>	<b>100</b>
<i>Bordeaux, FR. This wine opens with powerful aromatics of cassis, ripe boysenberry, and chaparral with hints of graphite, sage, fire-roasted meats and fresh brioche. The entry floods the palate with ripe dark fruit flavors of blackberry and black cherries as well as fresh minerality. Finishes with traces of tannin, and lingering sweet licorice with smooth acidity.</i>
